# SISTER MARY ROSE DOMINIC OF JESUS (1925-2010)

ur Sister Mary Rose Dominic of Jesus, O.P., went home to Our Lord on 10 February 2010, at Saint Catherine of Siena Convent and Infirmary in Caldwell, New Jersey.



Mary Rose Lynch was born on 9 October 1925 in Clonmore, Athboy, County Meath, Ireland to Thomas Lynch and Ellen McGeever; the fourth of five children. The family emigrated to the United States when Mary Rose was 22 years old. The four girls arrived in August 1947, while her brother had already emigrated in 1936.

She entered the Monastery of Our Lady of the Rosary in Summit, New Jersey, in December 1948; was clothed with the white Dominican habit in July 1949 and received the religious name Sister Mary Rose Dominic of Jesus, O.P. She made her Religious Profession of Temporary Vows in December 1950 and professed her Perpetual Vows in December 1953. On 21 November 1955, Sister Mary Rose Dominic was one of twenty-three sisters who professed Solemn Vows, thus making them full -fledged Nuns of the Order of Preachers. She became a naturalized U.S. citizen in June 1963.

Christmas was one of Sister Mary Rose Dominic's favorite times of the liturgical vear.

For more than sixty years, she steadfastly fulfilled various duties and household tasks, including that of portress, laundress and bell ringer. She voluntarily performed many other tasks around the monastery, foremost among them decorating rooms and halls for Christmas and Easter.

Her hymns and poems have been published in various magazines, anthologies, websites and in the Summit Choir Book. She was the author of two books published after entering the monastery: The Gospel Way of Life: A Book For Young People and The Mystery and Destiny of the Church, both of which she wrote under the pen name of Sister Rosena Marie.

After having proudly completed her annual decorating of the monastery for the 2009 Christmas season, and enjoying once again the celebration of the birth of Our Lord, Sister Mary Rose Dominic suffered a major stroke on 28 December. Following her hospitalization she was first moved to a local skilled nursing facility and then to Saint Catherine's Infirmary. She was visited quite often by our sisters and her family members and friends during the last weeks of her life, and she was sometimes able to recognize and even converse, although with difficulty, with those around her. When it looked as though death-as well as an impending blizzard-were imminent, one of our sisters went to spend the night with her and was at her bedside at the time of Sister's passing.

The Funeral Mass and final rites of Committal were held on 16 February in the monastery chapel and cemetery. The main celebrant for the Mass was Father Ciarán Fergus, O.P., chaplain of our monastery. The concelebrants were Father Brian Plate, pastor of Saint Teresa of Avila Church and Father Frank Maione, confessor of the *carillon bell, a duty which she was respon*nuns. In attendance were several of Sister's family members as well as representa- sible for in the monastery for more than tives of the Dominican Laity and members of the Rosary Shrine Guild.

The communion of saints had a significant role in Sister's spirituality. She believed that the church militant on earth, the church suffering in purgatory and the church triumphant in heaven are at the wellspring of Trinitarian communion and she had expressed these supernatural truths in her writings, especially in her hymns. For this reason, there is hope to believe that she will continue to think of and pray for her loved ones still on earth, especially the immediate members of her family and her sisters here in the monastery (and for future "aspirants" in particular.)

n December 8, 2009, the feast of the Immaculate Conception, Sister Carri Prewitt received the habit of the Order of Preachers and officially began her novitiate. Sister has taken the religious name Sister Mary Magdalene of the Immaculate Conception.

While the ceremony to receive a new novice is the same for each sister, there is always something unique about it each time it is performed. For Sister Mary Magdalene, her unique moment came as she had to endure having the prioress put her new side Rosary into place on the new belt around her waist without bursting into laughter (Sister is very ticklish!) Thankfully she retained her composure and made it through the rest of the ceremony before allowing her natural exuberance to burst forth as she greeted her sisters in the community room following the ceremony.
