Because this was also Candlemas Day we began the Mass with our traditional procession. For the very first time all the nuns came to the back of the chapel to lead the procession. After, they went back inside the enclosure except for Sister Mary Amata, Sister Denise Marie , Prioress and Sister Mary Catharine, Novice Mistress. We all enjoyed processing down the chapel aisle and experiencing the wonderful acoustics of our chapel as the chantresses sang the verses of the "Adorn your bridal chamber, Zion" while we sang the responses to each line. After the Second

Reading we sang the *Laetabundus* Sequence as is proper to the Order of Preachers.



The Rite of Profession began after the Gospel with the moving "What do you seek?" as Sr. Mary Amata lay prostrate on the sanctuary floor. As at each stage of formation she once again affirmed her desire for "God's mercy and yours." Bishop Cruz then delivered a powerful homily speaking about the nature of this request and the contemplative life.

After the homily Sister Denise Marie once again questioned Sister Mary Amata: " Do you wish to make profession according to the Constitutions of the Nuns of the Order of Preachers?" "Do you wish to advance in the love of God and neighbor, expending



yourself entirely in winning souls; do you wish to be totally consecrated to God to announce prophetically the blessings of Christ with your hidden fecundity; do you wish to persevere in prayer with Mary the Mother of Jesus." To each question Sister Mary Amata responded: "I do wish and desire it, with the help of God and yours!"

Then came the dramatic moment of the Litany of the Saints as Sister lay cruciform on the sanctuary floor. Finally the moment arrived. Placing her hands into those of Sister Denise Marie her prioress, Sister Mary Amata made profession of obedience until death.

The blessing and imposition of the veil followed. We had told Bishop Cruz earlier that only the prioress veils the newly professed but he wanted to help and it was a rather humorous moment which he commented on later, apologizing for "being disobedient". We suspect that Bishop Cruz was surprised at how



many straight pins it takes to keep a nun together! During the veiling the beautifully haunting *Amo Christum* was sung.

Sister Mary Amata then received the blessed ring "the ring of divine faith, given in the name of the most Holy Trinity." She was exhorted to "be faithful to Jesus, your Spouse, so that you may come to the wedding feast of eternal joy!"

Bishop Cruz then spontaneously led Sister Mary Amata inside the Nuns' choir so that the exchange of peace could be given. The Mass continued.

We thank God for this beautiful day and for the presence of so many wonderful friends. We are also so grateful to those who made this day possible.
